JAGUA TEMPORARY TATTOO

The following information was taken directly from the product's company along with additional tips from reputable sources. Subject to revision for accuracy and safety.

Warning: Anyone with allergies to citric acid, eucalyptus oil or any of the ingredients in the jagua gel should not use this product. Allergies to natural jagua can occur, although they are extremely rare. Keep contents away from the children and the eye area. Always first test jagua gel on a small part of your skin before proceeding. If you have any known allergies or are taking prescription medication, do not use this product. Jagua is not recommended for children under the age of 8. Never apply jagua to an infant. For external use only. Do not ingest. Avoid placement in areas that sweat or hold moisture or receive a lot of friction.

Jagua is an edible fruit that grows in the tropical rainforest of the Amazon.

Application

Skin must be cleaned beforehand. A gel/paste is squeezed onto your skin, which will stain it.

Developing & Aftercare

Your design will take 30-60 minutes to dry depending on the size but keep it on for at least 2-3 hours for best results.

Remove dry gel by washing it off under running water. Do not scrub.

At first you will see little to no color. THIS IS NORMAL.

Your design will start to darken and the color will fully develop over the next 24-48 hours. Do not apply any lotion or sunblock during the first 48 hours.

IMPORTANT: If you remove the dry gel at night before going to bed, cover your design in a way that it will not come in contact with other body parts or your sheets as it will stain them. Trust us: you don't want to be walking around with a replica of your hand tattoo on your face.

In order to prolong the life of your design, please follow these instructions:

- When showering, wash the tattoo area gently
- Avoid scrubbing with loofah or towel, scrubs and exfoliation products
- Avoid chlorine and other harsh chemicals
- Avoid soaking your tattoo in water in general
